MEDREG welcomes Lebanon and Morocco as new members

MILAN, ITALY – MEDREG welcomes two new members in the club of Mediterranean energy regulators with the recent joining of the Lebanese Centre for Energy Conservation (LCEC) and the Moroccan Electricity Regulatory Authority. With these new additions, the organisation counts an enlarged membership of 27 energy regulatory authorities from 22 countries, plus Mauritania as a perspective member.

Following two years of active involvement in the activities undertaken by MEDREG, the Lebanese Ministry of Energy and Water nominated the Lebanese Centre for Energy Conservation (LCEC) to represent Lebanon in our organisation. The LCEC was accepted by the General Assembly, held on 29 November in Istanbul.

Meanwhile, the appointment of Mr. Abdellatif Bardach as President of the Moroccan Electricity Regulatory Authority (ANRE) naturally formalised the membership of the recently established Moroccan regulator to MEDREG.
